Hamas has reportedly constructed an extensive network of tunnels in Gaza, spanning 300 miles, which functions as a multifaceted military hub. Israeli sources state that this subterranean network houses command centres, barracks for troops, and facilities dedicated to the production and storage of rockets.² The tunnel network in Gaza is remarkably extensive, spanning nearly double the length of the Cu Chi tunnels constructed by the Viet Cong during the Vietnam War. What sets this network apart is its sheer scale relative to the small area it occupies. Gaza covers an area of only about 140

square miles, yet it hosts an astonishing two miles of tunnels for every square mile of its territory. This dense concentration of tunnels under such a compact region is a notable aspect of the Gaza Strip's infrastructure. Gaza tunnels pose a significant threat to Israeli security. These underground passages enable Hamas and other militant groups to smuggle weapons, explosives, and militants

into Israeli territory. The ability to bypass traditional security measures creates a constant challenge for Israeli defence forces.

To counter the tunnel threat, Israel has implemented various measures. These include advanced technologies such as underground sensors, seismic detectors, and drones to detect and locate tunnels. Additionally, the Israeli military conducts regular operations to destroy or neutralise these tunnels, aiming to protect its borders and prevent potential attacks.
